



# Convenience Stores Keep Drivers Fueled

For the foreseeable future, gasoline will be the fuel of choice for U.S. drivers.



There are **228 MILLION** drivers in the United States,



and there are about **122,000** convenience stores



that sell **80%** of the gasoline sold in the country to keep U.S. drivers fueled up and on their way.

## Snapshot of the average U.S. driver:



**33 Miles**  
The average driver travels about 33 miles per day



**91%**  
Most Americans get to work each day by driving or carpooling



**50 Minutes**  
The average driver commutes 25 minutes each way to/from work



**522 Gallons**  
The average driver in the U.S. purchases about 522 gallons of gas per year



**77%**  
of gas customers pay with a credit or debit card



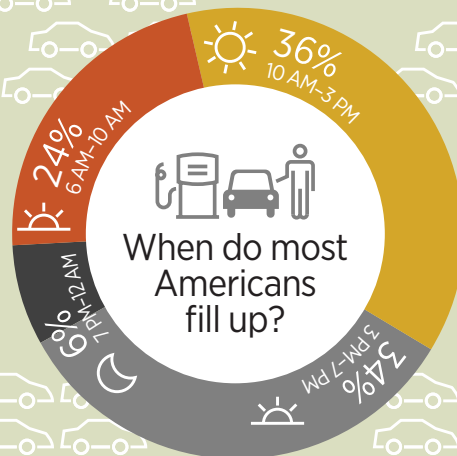
**58%**  
of gas customers say that price is the main consideration for where they fuel up



**52%**  
also go inside the convenience store to buy food and beverages, or use the ATM or restroom
